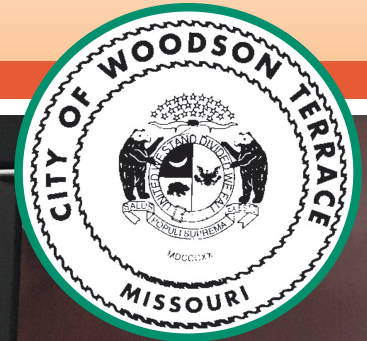

CAN WE TALK ABOUT PARKING?

Please, when parking in the street, be mindful of the curbs. It's not only against ordinance but parking over the curb in the grass causes problems for home owners, public works, police, meter readers, kids playing, and anyone who might be walking and not expecting a deep dip or hole in the yard. It also causes erosion during heavy rains, which can lead to another set of problems including sink holes, and even your house slipping. Please, park next to the curb and not in the yard. Police have been issuing warnings, and will start issuing tickets after fair warning has been made.

*W*ith spring and summer approaching, I wanted to remind our residents of few things and services.

The schools will be out for spring and summer break so please be mindful of children riding bicycles and enjoying outside activities. I would like to remind parents to talk with children about the dangers of playing in or near the street.

The Woodson Terrace Police Department has a P2D2 (prescription disposal) box located in the lobby of the Police Department. If you have any old or unused perceptions they can be placed in the box to be properly disposed of, no questions asked.

If you have a street light out on your street or anywhere Woodson Terrace please contact the police department and an officer will retrieve the light pole number so the light can be fixed. As some of you have noticed some of the lights that have gone out have been replaced with LED bulbs. These bulbs are brighter and help increase visibility at night. As the current bulbs burn out, these new bulbs are being installed.

If you are going to leave your home empty while on vacation please contact the Police Department for vacation checks while you're away.

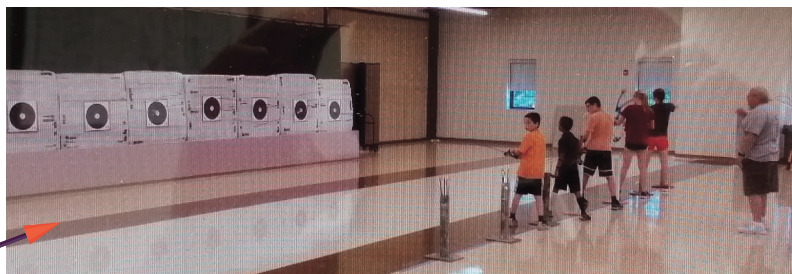
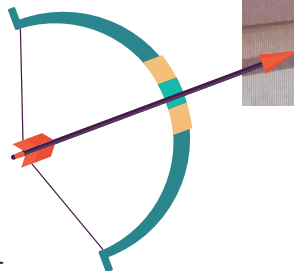

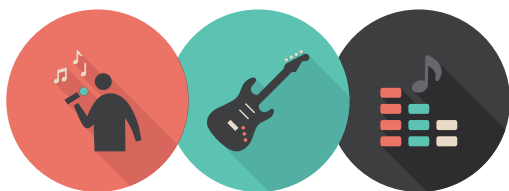
Parks & Special Projects

The City Hall and Police Department rely on a solid communication system to function. Rebuilding of the Information Technology, phone and fax systems are taking priority at this time.

Upcoming or active projects:

- Actively working on our ADA project for improvement of our sidewalks and ramps.
- Actively working on Economic Development.
- Expanded parking at the Community Center.
- Expansion of a successful project to acquire tax delinquent properties for rehabilitation.
- Reapply for the Municipal Park Grant to help replace our playground at John L. Brown Park. The playground will have new fall surface, age appropriate equipment, and improved access via extension of the asphalt path, and improved lighting.

Space heater SAFETY tips:



Make sure your space heater has the label showing that it is listed by a recognized testing laboratory.

Before using any space heater, read the manufacturer's instructions and warning labels carefully.

Inspect heaters for cracked or broken plugs or loose connections before each use. If frayed, worn or damaged, do not use the heater.

Never leave a space heater unattended. Turn it off when you're leaving a room or going to sleep, and don't let pets or children play too close to a space heater.

Space heaters are only meant to provide supplemental heat and should never be used to warm bedding, cook food, dry clothing or thaw pipes.

Install smoke alarms on every floor of your home and outside all sleeping areas and test them once a month.

Proper placement of space heaters is critical. Heaters must be kept at least three feet away from anything that can burn, including papers, clothing and rugs.

Locate space heaters out of high traffic areas and doorways where they may pose a tripping hazard.

Plug space heaters directly into a wall outlet. Do not use an extension cord or power strip, which could overheat and result in a fire. Do not plug any other electrical devices into the same outlet as the heater.

Place space heaters on level, flat surfaces. Never place heaters on cabinets, tables, furniture, or carpet, which can overheat and start a fire.

Always unplug and safely store the heater when it is not in use.

Canine Bart along with WT Police Sergeant/Canine Officer James Simonpietri was there too. Thank You Cheryl for all you & the ladies do & to Chief Mayberry & the WT Officers also. You all are so appreciated!

November 11th was the Veterans Day Ceremony & this year Veterans Day fell on a Saturday. The weather was beautiful too! Community Fire Protection District

brought their large ladder truck with the huge flag hoisted high in the air & we appreciate them for doing this & the firefighters who were present & stayed for the duration of the ceremony. American Legion Post #143 Honor Guard posted & retired the colors, conducted the gun salute, & played TAPS ... we've been Blessed & honored for their commitment not only @ this Ceremony, but all past Memorial & Veterans Day Ceremonies. Sheryl Gerrein was with us again to share her lovely voice as she led in several patriotic songs chosen by the Committee & also the Salute to the Armed Forces. The Committee did not meet in January & this newsletter will be reaching you after we meet on February 6th. The agenda for the meeting was posted outside of City Hall several weeks prior to the meeting for those interested in attending.

WOODSON TERRACE VOTERS WILL CONSIDER RENTAL CAR AGENCY BUSINESS LICENSE TAX INCREASE

At the April 3rd municipal election, voters in Woodson Terrace will consider raising the annual business license tax on motor vehicle rental car agencies from \$50.00 per motor vehicle available for rent or lease, to \$75.00. The annual license fee is charged for each motor vehicle which is available for rent or lease, to be rented from the service maintaining a store or garage within the City, as of July 1st of each year. The enabling ordinance has been in effect since 2004, at \$50.00.

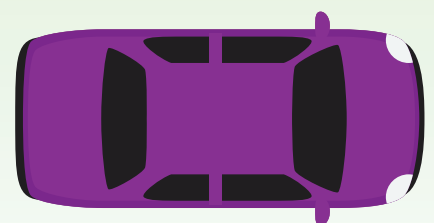
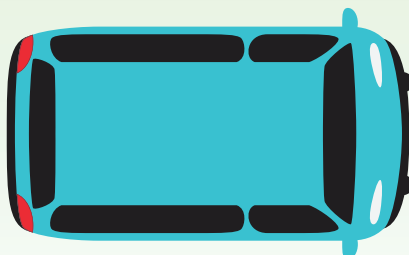
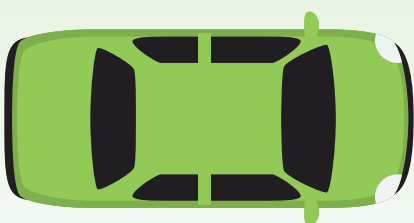
Woodson Terrace officials learned that other cities in the Airport area charge as much as \$75.00 per year per rental vehicle housed or available in that city.

“The cost of police protection and other city services for businesses has risen dramatically over the last 13 years,” says City Administrator, Doug Zaiz. Some of the cost results from calls to the car rental agencies. The Police Department reports that it spends considerable time each year investigating incidents at the car rental agencies located within the City. These incidents include break-ins, thefts, and also accidents when the vehicles are leaving or returning to the rental car site.

Police Chief C.V. (Butch) Mayberry noted that the amount of calls each year has increased to several hundred each year – to car rental agencies.

Mr. Zaiz pointed out that an increase in the business license tax will not affect the pocketbooks of residents of the City of Woodson Terrace, as only the car rental businesses pay the license tax. The increase will bring in additional revenue to the City to offset in part the ever-rising cost of police protection and other City services and in particular, those rental car agencies which do not by law collect sales tax on each transaction that other businesses in the City do.

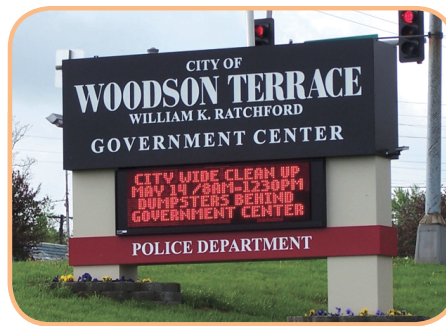
