2 out of **15** states and the District of Columbia experienced a decrease in fatality rates within 2 years of passing a hands-free law






6 states and the District of Columbia reported a decrease of more than 20 percent

95% of Missourians view people using hand-held devices to text or make phone calls behind the wheel as **Very Serious** or Somewhat **Serious**




Missouri is one of just **TWO STATES** without a no texting law for all drivers

and ONE of NINE **STATES** without a hands-free law for either all drivers or novice drivers

Distracted Driving isn't just a young driver problem 70% on Missouri's roads Approximately 70% 21 or younger

of drivers using cell phones in Missouri traffic crashes are 22 or older

AAA found that **96%** of drivers view typing on a hand-held cell phone while driving to be **very** or **extremely** dangerous, but 29% reported doing just that in the previous 30 days



Cell phone-related crashes in Missouri have increased by 31% since 2014 with nearly 2,500 crashes in 2018 alone.
