As it turned out each time we submitted a set of plans we were required to change something.

Those changes ranged from moving the building approximately 20 ft. to the east to being required to put a third restroom into our plans. From Lt. Halstead


We would like to share with you that our department is in the process of gaining accreditation though the Missouri State Law Enforcement Certification Program. This can take 3-5 years to complete. The goal is to standardize the operation and function of the police department. This process is overseen by the Missouri Police Chiefs Association.

Over the last three years, the Officers in our department have received over 2000 hours of continuing education, known as POST training. This training is required to retain their professional certification with the Missouri POST Commission. I commend our officers for staying abreast of the ever changing laws and providing our residents with the finest service available.

Please be aware winter is fast approaching: therefore prepare your vehicles for the cold conditions. When winter storm warnings are in place please take precautions and remove your vehicles from the roadways to the lawn or adjacent sidewalks until the streets are cleared.

The safety of everyone is really the issue here. If the roads cannot be properly cleaned, emergency personnel cannot get through. Officers have to get out in the slick conditions and write citations, also dangerous as they're standing in unclean roads where cars could slide. It's true; better safe than sorry.

October 1 was the start of the normal weekly Thursday chipping schedule which will end June 30, have your limbs out at least the day before. With the cool weather and light rainfall, it is a great opportunity to check your fencerows and maintain them. We have many residents that cut their grass but avoid the rear and side fencerows. Invasive plants like honeysuckle and mulberries grow wild destroying fences. Most of our fences whether chain link or privacy, are shared with a neighbor. Whether technically your or their fence, your side should be maintained and no vegetation should contact the fence. We have many destroyed fences in the city because of this neglect. The resident and landlord are responsible and it is a violation.

A reminder, your last trash pickup day of each month, is bulk pickup day. Get rid of those unneeded items cluttering up your property.

Call Republic at 636-947-5959 if you have questions about this service. Please put items for bulk pick up out with your normal trash, not days in advance.

I have noticed residents are putting in firewood for the winter, but stacking it in contact with the ground is a violation. The wood should be 12" off the ground.

Major construction of the new Community Center in John L. Brown Park should be starting hopefully November 1. With the construction will come disruptions to normal activities in the park, we are asking everyone visiting the park to be patient and careful during construction.

City of **Woodson Terrace General Guidelines**

TRASH GUIDELINES

- By law, only non-hazardous household solid waste can be collected. Liquid waste products **cannot** be collected in a liquid
- Trash is limited to 95 gallon trash cart provided by Republic Services.
- Non-hazardous liquids can be mixed with an absorbent such as Kitty Litter, but MUST be completely dry & with the lid off the container to show the driver that it is dried out.
- Trash with yardwaste mixed in <u>cannot</u> be collected. Trash in cardboard boxes <u>cannot</u> be collected.
- Items over four feet (4') high or long must be broken down or cut to four feet (4') or less.
- Loose materials must be containerized or bundled
- Rubbish (waste that rots and stinks) should be bagged <u>AND</u> the bag(s) should be placed in the trash cart. Republic Services will NOT be responsible for any garbage spread about when animals or birds rip any such bag(s) open
- Trash service for Senior Citizens at a discounted price is available. Residents must go to City Hall of Woodson Terrace to apply for Senior Discount.
- Medically necessary needles (sharps), such as diabetic syringes will only be collected when in approved sharps containers which are available from your syringe supplier or you may use a
- puncture proof container with a tightly closed lid. **Bulky Trash** includes any type of solid waste that **cannot** be placed into a 95 gallon trash cart. Bulky Trash does NOT placed into a 95 gallon trash cart. Bulky Irash does NOI include major appliances, automobile parts or components, construction debris or any other such items. The items are serviced at the end of each month on trash pick up day. All boxes need to be broken down and placed in recycle cart. We request that bulky items be limited to two (2) items per pick up. Please call Customer Service to schedule any Bulky pickup.
- Major Appliances (White Goods) are to be scheduled for collection through Republic Services Customer Service (636) 947-5959. There is an additional charge for this service. Limit of two appliances per pick up.
- Tires and Batteries will not be collected
- Construction material or the materials that result from home remodeling projects will not be picked up as part of normal trash

or as bulk trash. Some examples of the materials we are unable to pick up

- Carpeting and other flooring materials
- Cabinets
- Wood (e.g., 2X4's, plywood, paneling, peg board)
- Bathroom fixtures (toilets, tubs, commodes)
- Kitchen fixtures (cabinets, islands, Etc.)
- Plumbing (pipes, sinks)
- Large light fixtures (if the fixture does not fit in a 32gallon can with the lid secured normally, we are unable to pick up)
- Roofing material (e.g., shingles, ceramic roof tiles, tar paper, gutters, fascia boards)

This above list is not all-inclusive. Please contact our Republic Services Customer Service office to inquire out having construction items picked up for an additional charge

YARDWASTE GUIDELINES

- Yardwaste with trash mixed in cannot be collected.
- Loose yardwaste must be bagged in standard 30-gallon PAPER yardwaste bags or placed in designated 32-gallon or smaller yardwaste cans or in Republic Services yardwaste carts.
- YARDWASTE IN PLASTIC BAGS WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.
- YARDWASTE IN CARDBOARD BOXES WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.
- Yardwaste carts are to be used for yardwaste ONLY.
 Customer-owned containers used for yardwaste should be marked with the letter "X" or the words "Yardwaste
- diameter must be tied (with TWINE NO WIRE) in bundles no bigger than four feet (4') long by twenty-four inches (24") in diameter; however, no bundle is to weigh more than fifty (50) pounds. Limbs and branches six inches (6") or more in diameter are considered Bulky Trash.
- Christmas trees will be collected at no additional charge the first two weeks of January. The tree must be free of all decorations including tinsel, garland, ornaments and lights. The tree must also be cut shorter than six feet (6') in

RECYCLE GUIDELINES

Once Weekly Service: Republic Services provides a 65 gallon recycle cart. See attached for a current list of acceptable recycle materials.

COLLECTION SCHEDULES

In order to insure collection of your trash, yardwaste, and recycling, please put them out for collection at the curbside BY 7:00 AM on your scheduled collection day.

There will be no collections on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day or Christmas Day. The change in service days will be for that day on which the holiday falls. If the holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday no change in weekly trash pickup will occur. – When the holiday falls on a weekday, ALL days following a holiday ROLL

For Example:
If the holiday is on a Monday: Monday goes on Tuesday Tuesday goes on Wednesday Wednesday goes on Thursday Thursday goes on Friday Friday goes on Saturday

CARTS: 95-gallon yard waste are available for an additional fee. Please contact our Customer Service additional fee. Please contact our Department to inquire about lease fees.

BILLING: All invoices are to be paid no later than the date shown on the invoice. Any account that is not paid in full by the due date on the invoice will be put on "Stop Service" status and service will not be provided until the invoice has been paid in full. Credits for time on Stop Service will **NOT** be given.

CUSTOMER SERVICE: The Republic Services Customer Service Department is open to receive telephone calls from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday of each week, excluding holidays

Woodson Terrace Neighborhood Watch

Over the past several months situations have been reported and vehicles have been broken into on Margo Lane. Cars were left unlocked. Items were stolen. If you see any suspicious vehicles or persons in your area, document the date, time, vehicle, description, people description and license plate number. Then call our Woodson Terrace Police. We need to help our neighbors by being vigilant. You may think the little things don't matter, but you should let our Police decide this.

On July 1, 2015, Woodson Terrace had some pretty bad weather. Trees were knocked down over homes, vehicles, fences and more. This is the time when predators are at their best. If you hire a contractor, please stay at the job site at the time they arrive and see that the work is done correctly. Don't leave for the day and stick a note on your neighbor's door and expect them to take care of your responsibility. Some people have done this. Always use a licensed contractor and check references. Ask to see a copy of their license. If possible, get more than one estimate and make sure the estimates are in writing. Never pay a contractor in full before the work is completed; don't pay in cash, and never sign a blank contract. Make sure you understand all of the contract terms. If someone is adamantly trying to get you to do the job "today" for a discount, be wary. Never allow someone to talk you into doing something you may not be ready for. Check with the Better Business Bureau regarding the person/company you are hiring.

We also have intermittent electrical outages here in Woodson Terrace. You can help deter this by keeping your trees and limbs cut that are in the tree-lines or will be in the tree-lines. People don't realize that over the years, the leaves from the trees rub up against the Ameren wires and gradually make the electrical wires "bare or bald". This causes some of our outages. We can be pro-active with this issue. If you have any questions about cutting your limbs on your trees around wires, please call Ameren Electric. Always keep "Safety" in mind.

THE FOLLOWING ARE SOME THINGS YOUR BURGLAR WON'T TELL YOU:

If you don't answer when I knock, I try the door. Occasionally, I hit the jackpot and walk right in.

To you, leaving that window open just a crack during the day is a way to let a little fresh air in. To me, it's an invitation.

I love looking in your windows. I'm looking for signs that you are home; and for flat screen TVs or gaming systems that I would like. I'll drive or walk through your neighborhood at night, before you close the blinds or curtains; just to pick my targets.

I'll break a window to get in; even if it makes a little noise. If your neighbor hears one loud sound, he will probably stop what he is doing and wait to hear it again. If he doesn't hear it again, he will just go back to what he/she was doing. It's human nature.

If decorative glass is part of your front entrance, don't let your glarm company install the control pad where I can see if it is set. That makes it too easy.

I always knock first. If you answer' I'll ask for directions somewhere or offer to clean your gutters or something else. (Don't take me up on it.)

Of course I look familiar. I was here just last week cleaning your carpets, painting your shutters, or delivering your new refrigerator, couch or stove. Yes, I really do look for newspapers piled up on the driveway. And I might leave a pizza flyer in your front door to see how long it takes you to remove it.

A good security company alarms the window over the sink. And the windows on the second floor; which often access the master bedroom and your jewelry. It's not a bad idea to put motion detectors up there too.

Do you really think that I won't look in your sock drawer? I always check dresser drawers, the bedside table, and the medicine cabinet.

You are right: I won't have enough time to break into that safe where you keep your valuables. But if it's not bolted down, I'll take it with me.

A loud TV or radio can be a better deterrent than the best alarm system. If you are reluctant to leave your TV on while you're out of town; you can buy a device that works on a timer and simulates the flickering glow of a real television.

Sometimes, I carry a clipboard. Sometimes, I dress like a lawn guy and carry a rake. I do my best to never ever look like a crook.

The two things I hate most: loud dogs and nosy neighbors.

Avoid announcing your vacation on your Facebook page. It's easier than you think to look up your address.

Reminder: If you would like to check out our Neighborhood Watch Metal Pen I.D.Tool Engraver for marking and identifying any personal items you may have with your own unique I.D., please contact me at the phone number below. It is "FREE", but you have to return it. It is checked out similar to a library. You check it out for a period of time; then you return it in the same condition as you borrowed it. Some people use it to I.D. their electronic equipment, lawnmowers, bicycles, etc...




WARNER'S WARM-UP NOV. 1ST-NOV. 14TH, 2015




