

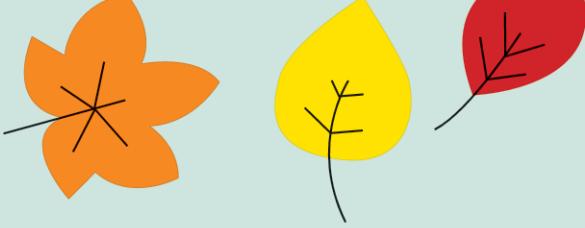

From The Mayor's Desk

*I*t has been a while since our last newsletter so I will attempt to get everyone up to date on city issues.

We have been enforcing some ordinances that have not been utilized in several years. Parking on the grass at the curb causes ruts and it makes the city look bad. We have been working hard trying to get new businesses and before they commit they do extensive studies on our city and how it looks.

Another ordinance that has been overlooked and abused is the one about yard sales. All yard sales require a permit. (no cost) When your sale is finished you are responsible for removing any signs related to the sale. There is a restriction of 4 sales allowed in one calendar year.

We have also been working hard to get the housing code violations corrected. Keep in mind a warning is nothing more than a reminder. However if you ignore the reminder the next step leads to a ticket. The better shape our housing is the more our properties will be worth.

The board and I believe that we have one of the best Police Departments in the County. If you get a chance stop and talk to our officers, I believe you will also have the same opinion.

Our public works has again done a great job this summer keeping the grass cut in the city. It is really difficult to keep up with cutting the vacant houses with our small crew. I cannot say enough about how well they keep our park manicured. We continually receive glowing comments from those who use our park.

If you have received a ticket and must deal with our courts please keep in mind that the ladies in our court have no decision making abilities. The decisions are handled by the judge and prosecuting attorney. Please give them the respect they deserve because they only process the documents.

The city as recently passed a resolution proclaiming our position in the city county merger effort. It is our opinion that those services that we provide will disappear if the merger ever come to fruition. We will continue to fight it until it is discarded. There is nothing eminent but you cannot ignore that people are working to get it done. If you know anyone who is serviced by the St. Louis County Police, those officers (who do an excellent job) are spread thin. A merger will require a vote of the people and I will continue to keep everyone up to date.

Beginning this week we will be open at the community center on Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 6 AM until 10 AM and on Tuesday's and Thursdays from 12 PM until 2 PM so that the residents can use our small workout room which consists of a recumbent bike a treadmill and an elliptical. WE are currently looking to add one more machine. We will also allow persons to walk around our large room if you would like to get out of the weather.

From The Chief



*P*roposition P, which the voters approved in April 2017, will soon be providing additional funds to benefit the Woodson Terrace Police Department.

The purpose in passing this proposition was to supplement the existing police budget with money that could be used for pay increases, equipment purchases/upgrades and additional training opportunities.

At the August Board of Alderman meeting I submitted a 2/3 year budget proposal outlining a plan for the expenditure of these monies. The Board of Alderman unanimously approved my proposal which includes, but not limited to, the following;

- **Increase officer pay.**
- **Upgrading the department's evidence storage and tracking capabilities.**
- **Improve and upgrade the department's security and interview surveillance system to include a "safe" zone where child custody and merchandise exchanges can be monitored and recorded.**
- **Purchasing a portable speed trailer that can be placed throughout the city to alert drivers of their speed.**
- **Having an additional K-nine trained and prepared to take over for K-nine Bart who will be nearing his retirement in 2019.**

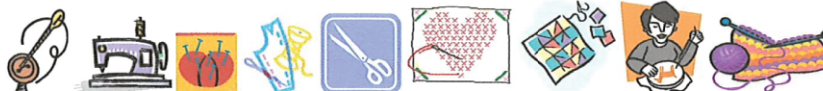

Public Works

There is a lot going on in the City right now. We recently established an American with Disabilities (ADA) Transition Plan. This policy will improve infrastructure using construction guidelines for sidewalks and ramps, making it possible for those with disabilities to have safe access to and from all sidewalks in the City.

Our Public Works department resumed normal chipping hours October 5th. Every Thursday (except holidays), the chipper will visit every street, weather permitting. You do not need to call, but it is helpful if you have them down on Wednesday so you don't get passed by.

We are working on vacant property issues in conjunction with property maintenance in general. High foreclosure and absentee owners/ landlords are adding to the already weighty problem.

Lastly, the Mayor and Board of Alderman have appointed me to the position of City Administrator. I appreciate this opportunity and will do all I can do to represent the City in a respectable manner, create policies to help all departments provide excellent City services and safe surroundings, improve amenities, and increase property values.

The information on the disk is compatible with the format required by the "AMBER ALERT" program.</p>	 <p>The dental bite wafer provides an impression of the biting surface of the child's teeth, which like fingerprints, are unique to each individual. The wafer also collects enough saliva to provide a DNA sample and a source for a scent for trained canine search and recovery teams.</p>

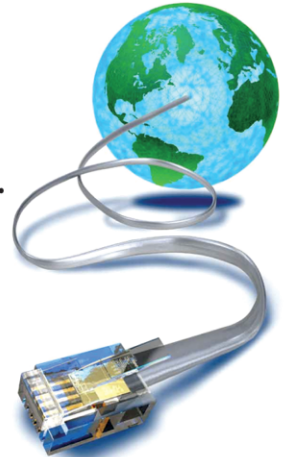

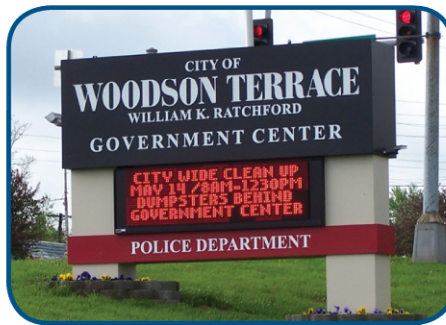
