Our Police Department is one of the most professional units that I have seen since if have been Mayor. I feel confident that when I leave the city will not miss a step providing, we have elected a good candidate.



# CITY ADMINISTRATOR

The City has been doing street paving of selected streets for the past two summers. This program has worked well, and we plan to continue this project to have all our streets paved. Streets are chosen using the PASER system to prioritize streets for repair. If your street has not been selected, please be patient as the worst streets are repaired first. We are required to request bids for each summer paving project. We are trying vinyl stop bars at the stop signs. In the past we have painted stop bars, and we are comparing which type works best for our streets.

A new project is underway in John L. Brown Park. The old restrooms near the playground are being demolished. The new building will be in the same location. Rallo Construction won the bid for the project, and completion is expected by spring of 2026. We applied for a grant from St. Louis County Parks program to assist with funds for this park project.

# City of Woodson Terrace Public Works Department

## Seasonal Update from the Woodson Terrace Public Works Department

As the colors of fall surround us and winter draws near, the Woodson Terrace Public Works Department is busy preparing for the challenges and responsibilities that come with changing weather. Our crews are dedicated to keeping our community safe, clean, and accessible through every season.

This time of year, we ask residents to take a few simple but important steps to help us keep Woodson Terrace running smoothly.

## Proper Leaf Disposal – Keep Leaves Out of the Street and Drains

Falling leaves are beautiful, but they can create big problems when not properly managed. **Please do not blow or rake leaves into the street or into stormwater collection inlets. You also cannot burn leaves.** When leaves and other debris are left on the road, they can block storm drains, causing localized flooding during heavy rains and degrading water quality in our streams and rivers.

Instead, we ask residents to:

- Collect leaves in biodegradable paper bags or approved containers for curbside pickup by Waste Connections.
- Avoid mixing sticks, rocks, or other debris with leaf piles.
- Keep piles at least a foot away from the curb to allow water to flow to the drains.

These simple steps help prevent flooding, protect our stormwater system, and keep our neighborhoods clean and safe.

## Drive Safely During Inclement Weather

As fall turns to winter, weather conditions can change quickly. Wet leaves, early morning frost, and the season's first snowfalls can make roads slick and visibility poor. The Public Works Department reminds all drivers to **slow down, allow extra stopping distance, and use caution during inclement conditions.**

Our crews are out in all kinds of weather—clearing leaves, patching roads, and later in the season, plowing and salting streets. Your patience and careful driving help ensure the safety of both residents and Public Works personnel.

## Winter Parking Reminder – Move Vehicles When Snowfall Exceeds 2"

When winter storms arrive, our snow removal operations go into full effect. To help our plow drivers clear streets efficiently and safely, **please remove vehicles from the street whenever snowfall exceeds two inches (2").**

Vehicles parked on the street during plowing operations can slow down our response, create safety hazards, and prevent roads from being fully cleared curb-to-curb. In accordance with city ordinance, vehicles left in violation during snow events may be ticketed or towed.

We appreciate everyone's cooperation in making sure our streets stay safe and accessible for all residents and emergency vehicles.

## Stormwater Awareness – Small Actions, Big Impact

The fall season often brings increased rainfall, which can put stress on our stormwater system. Keeping storm drains clear of leaves, litter, and debris helps prevent backups and flooding. You can lend a hand by checking the storm drain near your home and removing any obstructions if it's safe to do so.

Every small effort adds up—clean storm drains protect property, reduce maintenance costs, and improve water quality throughout our community.

As another busy season unfolds, the Woodson Terrace Public Works Department would like to extend a sincere **thank you** to all residents for your continued cooperation, understanding, and support. Whether it's keeping leaves out of the street, moving vehicles during snow events, or simply driving safely in challenging conditions, your efforts make a meaningful difference.

- ✅ **Install CO alarms** near the bedrooms of your home.
- 🔋 **Test alarms monthly** and **change batteries yearly**.
- 🔧 **Have furnaces, chimneys, and vents inspected** by a professional each year.
- 🚫 **Never use grills, generators, or vehicles indoors**, even with doors open.

#### 🔔 If Your CO Alarm Sounds

- 🚪 **Leave the building immediately.**
- 📞 **Call 911** once you're outside and safe.
- 🚒 **The Community Fire Protection District** will respond and ensure your home is safe before you return.

👁️ Remember: CO **can't be seen or smelled**, but it **can be prevented**.

## A MESSAGE FROM YOUR CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION GENERAL HOLIDAY SAFETY AND CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

### AT HOME

- Make sure all doors and windows have secondary locks (window pins, deadbolts, dowels, etc.) and use them!
- Don't hide spare keys in mailboxes or planters, or under doormats.
- Ensure that dark areas and entrances have outdoor lights that are turned on after dark or are activated by sensors.
- Keep trees and shrubbery trimmed so they do not conceal doors and windows. Remember, overgrown foliage can provide a hiding place for criminals.
- Place gifts where they can't be seen from the outside.
- Consider safe deposit boxes for coin and stamp collections, seldom-worn jewelry, stock bonds, etc.
- Be sure to mail cards, checks or gift certificates from the Post Office.
- Lock your vehicle and remove all the valuables. Yes, even in your driveway.

### STRANGERS AT YOUR DOOR

- Use caution anytime there is a stranger at your door.
- Be suspicious of unexpected sales calls or deliveries. Ask for identification.

- Be aware of scams that criminals commit to take advantage of people's generosity during the holidays.
- Investigate charities before making donations. Ask how the funds will be used.



### LEAVING FOR THE HOLIDAYS

- Ask a trusted friend, neighbor or Neighborhood Watch member to watch your home.
- Use timers for lights and radios while you're away.
- Remember to make arrangements for mail and newspapers.

### AFTER THE HOLIDAYS

- Don't advertise expensive toys, electronics, or other gifts received by the boxes left for garbage collections. Compress large boxes and place them in black garbage bags for pick-up.
- Add new items to your home inventory. Take photos or video of all items of value in your home and list each item's make, model, serial number and other information.
- Engrave new items to help identify them in the event they are stolen.

4. Use a Smart Lock
5. Install Security Cameras

3. Set Up Notifications to Track Your Packages
4. Install a Security Camera
5. Get Your Packages Delivered to Your Office

7. Reschedule Delivery or Ask for a Package Hold When on Vacation
8. Try Smart Locks
9. Get a Package Guard
10. Insure Your Packages
11. Ask Your Neighbors to Grab Your Packages


Woodson Terrace is updating its comprehensive plan! An advisory committee is helping guide the process.

This Fall, the *Discovery Report* was released, highlighting existing conditions, trends, key issues, and insights from the community survey.






