From The Mayor's Desk



I have served as your mayor for the last 20 years. I will be retiring in April of this year. It was a pleasure to represent our residents.

Since I have been mayor, the City has built a new City Hall and Police Department. We have also built the Community Center in John L. Brown Park. Currently we are adding a new restroom facility in the park.

It looks like I am a smart mayor, however none of this would have been accomplished without our City Manager Doug Zaiz and our City Engineer Vijay Bhasin who was hired in 2006. In these projects they led us and kept the City's needs as a priority. Mr. Bhasin has also helped decipher plans from businesses that want to make the City of Woodson their Terrace home.

Unfortunately, Mr. Bhasin is also retiring, and he will be missed!

The City's Police Department is in excellent shape, and we have officers from other communities begging to work for our city.

CITY ELECTIONS

We have three candidates and two of them have city experience.

One candidate has no experience at all.

Caroline Martin, Alderwoman of Ward 1 who is first on the ballot, has been an Alderwoman for 8 years. She has the most experience of all the candidates. She has served on 5 committees, Veterans Committee, Planning and Zoning, Public Works, and Budget Wage & Job

Study. She is also active in the VFW and American Legion which are in the Town Hall located on Guthrie Avenue. She runs Toys for Tots, helps with Christmas in the streets. She also helps with almost every event the city sponsors, the Easter Egg hunt, breakfast with Santa, tree lighting and is active in the Senior community, and the Veterans Ceremonies. She participates in every event the city sponsors.

She never says no to any request that helps our city residents.

The second candidate is Ward 4 Alderman Jack Belford. Jack is a very intelligent man. However, he has only been Alderman since April of 2024. That does not disqualify him. When I ran for Mayor in 2006, I had 12 years' experience as an Alderman. I would not try to tell him what to do but I believe he should gain more experience. I like Jack and I asked him to replace an Alderman who moved to another community. I really and truly believe he will be a great asset to the city. Experience is the key.

The third candidate is Al Turnbough. Mr. Turnbough has no experience. Mr. Turnbough seems to dislike our Public Works employees and the Police Department. I believe he has an agenda dealing with punishing employees at Public Works and the Police Department.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR

Our street resurfacing program is progressing, as we are evaluating the next phase of streets to be resurfaced. We plan on doing the same amount of footage as in the past two years. We have been averaging six to seven streets per season. We will go out for bid once we have the final streets selected. The same company has been awarded the contract twice due to their lowest bid for the streets program. This system allows us to make progress on street improvement, while staying within budget.

If you haven't signed up for Text.gov, I encourage you to call City Hall, and they will sign you up for text messaging. Text.gov, allows the City to notify residents of City projects, such as street paving. A text from the City, concerning paving locations, could avoid driving inconvenience.

Work continues on the new restrooms in JLB Park. The building is located adjacent to the playground area. Crews are hoping to have the project completed by the end of April.

From the Desk of the Director of Public Works

As we move into a new season, I want to start by extending our warmest congratulations and best wishes to Scott Doerr on his retirement. Scott has been a dedicated member of our team, and his years of service to the community are truly appreciated. We wish him all the best in this next chapter.

This past winter brought exceptionally harsh conditions, including extreme cold temperatures and multiple water main breaks throughout the city. I want to thank our residents for their patience and our public works crew for their tireless efforts during these difficult weeks. Looking ahead, we have selected a new salt vendor for the 2026–2027 winter season—this change will lower costs while providing a higher-quality treated salt to improve road safety during snow and ice events. With warmer weather approaching, we shift our focus to spring maintenance. Increased rain means grass will soon be growing quickly, so this is a friendly reminder not to blow grass or leaves into the street or stormwater inlets. Doing so can clog the system and lead to localized flooding.

Spring is also a good time to inspect the trees on your property. Look for broken or dead limbs that may pose safety risks. “Dead-wooding” not only improves the appearance of your property but also helps protect both your home and the surrounding neighborhood. Over the next several weeks, the Public Works crew


will be out evaluating and repairing streets affected by winter weather. Please give our crews plenty of room to work and slow down when traveling through work zones. Your cooperation keeps everyone safe.

If you’re looking for a way to give back, openspacestl.org is seeking volunteers for the Confluence Trash Bash on April 11th. This is a great opportunity to help clean up Missouri streams and support environmental stewardship in our region.

We sometimes forget that patriotism doesn't always look like parades or fireworks. It's quiet resilience. It's coming together after tragedy, helping a neighbor in crisis, voting when you're tired and disillusioned because you still believe your voice matters. It's choosing to hope, even when history has given you reasons not to.

The soul of a nation is not its monuments or its laws—it is its people. And when people choose love over fear, unity over division, and truth over silence, that is patriotism at its most powerful. It's not easy. It asks much and promises little. But in the end, it gives us something priceless: the sense that we are part of something bigger than ourselves.

Patriotism, when it is real, is not about domination or pride. It's about responsibility. It's about standing up for your country—not just when it shines, but especially when it falters. It's the kind of love that doesn't walk away. The kind that rebuilds. The kind that believes, always, that we can be better.

My uncle served in the military and later became a police officer and detective. I have another uncle who had served as protection for Dr Martin Luther King JR during a civil rights march. I found this incredibly inspiring and brave. Their willingness to serve and stand up for their country, trying to make it a better place greatly inspired me. It taught me that true patriotism is about more than just words, it's about action and sacrifice.

The Minister of the church I attend whom I greatly respect was in the military, adding to the examples of commitment and service that have shaped my understanding of what it means to love your country. A few months ago, I visited a state legislator who is an Air Force veteran. I spent the day shadowing her in Jefferson City. She sees how dedication, discipline, and acts of service can continue even after your military duty is over. Her advice encouraged me to stay informed, as well as to speak up.

During that experience, I learned that patriotism doesn't always necessarily have to be risking your life for your country, but it could also be shown through everyday actions. This could be by showing leadership or even helping others out when you can.

Inspired by these amazing people, I have tried to give back to my community in my own ways. Anytime I can on Sunday, I usher at my church, trying to help create a welcoming environment for others. On holidays, I volunteer to serve meals at the church for those who might not have a hot meal. I believe these small acts of service can make a very meaningful difference, kind of like the butterfly effect. These experiences have taught me the value of compassion and commitment. Each time I see someone in an army uniform, I make it a point to thank them for their service and recognize that their sacrifices help protect the freedom we all enjoy and that defines our country. Patriotism, to me, also means respecting and supporting the diverse people who make up my community and this country as a whole. Whenever I encounter someone who is homeless or unhoused, and I have something to give, I try to offer what I can. I also try to make an effort to understand and appreciate the different cultures and perspectives present in my school, church, and even at camp. Ultimately, I believe that being patriotic means caring for those around me, no matter their background or circumstances.

Whether it's helping someone in need, listening to a new perspective, or just simply showing kindness, these actions remind me that we are all connected one way or another. My goal is to make my community stronger by showing respect and compassion to everyone I meet, because that is how I believe we can build a better community and stronger country together.
